
EUCHARISTIC ADORATION EVENING PRAYER and BENEDICTION



PSALTER WEEK II



The Divine Office, the public prayer of the people of God, has always been considered among the first duties of the Church. Over the centuries, the traditional elements of this prayer were carefully arranged to sanctify the whole day in prayer and adoration of almighty God.

The Office of Vespers, the traditional Evening Prayer of the Church, offers to God our praise for the day that is ending, and in the words of the Magnificat, 'glorifies the Lord' for His goodness to us.

Introduction

The Priest says:

O God, come to my aid.

All say:

O Lord, make haste to help me.

All say: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

Hymn 'O saving victim'

O saving Victim, open wide The gate of heaven to us below. Our foes press on from every side; Your aid supply, your strength bestow.

To your great name be endless praise, Immortal Godhead, One in Three; O grant us endless length of days In our true native land with thee. Amen.

Psalmody

The reader says:

You cannot serve both God and wealth.

All say:

Hear this, all you peoples, give heed, all who dwell in the world, men both low and high, rich and poor alike!

My lips will speak words of wisdom. My heart is full of insight. I will turn my mind to a parable, with the harp I will solve my problem.

Why should I fear in evil days the malice of the foes who surround me, men who trust in their wealth, and boast of the vastness of their riches?

For no man can buy his own ransom, or pay a price to God for his life. The ransom of his soul is beyond him. He cannot buy life without end, nor avoid coming to the grave.

Worthy are you, O Lord, to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed men for God from every tribe and tongue and people and nation. You have made us a kingdom and priests to our God,

and we shall reign on earth.

Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth, and wisdom and might, and honour and glory and blessing.

Worthy is the lamb that was slain, to receive glory and honour.

Scripture Reading

Romans 3:23-25a

The reader says:

Since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, they are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as an expiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness.

We pray in silent adoration of the Blessed Sacrament for a short while.

The Magnificat

The reader says:

Do great things for us, O Lord, for you are mighty, and Holy is your name.

All say:

My soul glorifies the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour. He looks on his servant in her lowliness; henceforth all ages will call me blessed.

The Almighty works marvels for me. Holy his name! His mercy is from age to age, on those who fear him.

He puts forth his arm in strength and scatters the proud-hearted. He casts the mighty from their thrones and raises the lowly.

He fills the starving with good things, sends the rich away empty.

He protects Israel, his servant, remembering his mercy, the mercy promised to our fathers, to Abraham and his sons for ever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

All say:

Do great things for us, O Lord, for you are mighty, and Holy is your name.

Intercessions

The Priest says:

Christ is the shepherd of his flock: he loves and cares for his people. We turn to him in trust and say:

The reader says:

Christ our Lord, you are the High Priest, — raise up in your Church men to serve as holy Priests of your sacrifice and your Sacraments.

 \mathbf{R} Lord, we need your care.

The reader says:

Christ our Lord, you came not to be served but to serve, — grant to your Church true ministers of your name to serve as Deacons.

 \mathbf{R} Lord, we need your care.

The reader says:

Christ our Lord, you have granted to each to share in your mission, draw men and women to that mission as religious Brothers and Sisters.

 $\mathbf{\tilde{R}}$ Lord, we need your care.

The Lord's Prayer

The Priest says:

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

All say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Benediction

The Priest goes to the altar, genuflects and kneels. Then this hymn is sung during which the Priest incenses the Blessed Sacrament.

Concluding Prayer

The Priest says:

Lord Jesus Christ, you gave your Church an admirable Sacrament as the abiding memorial of your passion. Teach us so to worship the sacred mystery of your Body and Blood, that its redeeming power may sanctify us always. Who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. R Amen.

The Priest puts on the humeral veil and blesses the congregation with the Blessed Sacrament.

The Priest says: Let us adore forever this Most Holy Sacrament.

All say:

Praise the Lord, all you nations:sing his praises, all you peoples.For he has shown us His loving kindness;the truth of the Lord remains forever.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

All say:

Let us adore forever this Most Holy Sacrament.

Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament

The Priest stands and returns to the altar and reposes the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle and genuflects.

Marian Anthem 'Hail, Queen of Heaven'
